#### Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families, we hope you have all had a great half-term break and looking forward to the Spring term!

Now that the weather is warming up, we will recommence our Reception and Year 1 Forest School sessions. Information regarding this provision will be communicated directly to YR and Y1 parents.

#### Internet Safety Day: 11th February

In February, our pupils took part in special Internet Safety Day assemblies, where they learned about the dangers of online scams and the important message: "If it's too good to be true, it probably is!" Through engaging discussions and real-life examples, children in both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 explored how to recognize suspicious online offers, fake prizes, and misleading adverts. They learned to think critically and stay cautious when navigating the digital world. We encourage you to continue these conversations at home; ask your child what they learned and discuss ways to stay safe online together.

This week, our Y3/4 Football team is starting the league games on Friday 28th February.

Science is all about change, discovery, and finding ways to adapt to our ever-changing world. We are ending Science Week on Monday 17th March with a Birds of Prey whole school workshop! At the end of the day, the school will view a flight demonstration.

#### **Science Week Poster Competition**

We're inviting all students from Reception to Year 4 to take part in our exciting Change and Adapt poster competition.

The theme for 2025 is 'Change and adapt, - there are loads of STEM topics to be explored. Pupils could create a poster showing how plants and animals adapt to changing seasons or surroundings, or how humans have adapted to changing technology. They could look at climate change and how we can adapt our behaviours to protect the environment, or their favourite science experiment and how it shows change. The more creative the interpretation of the theme, the better!

With Carnival just around the corner, our children are discovering fascinating facts about this special festivity. Did you know that Portuguese Carnival has roots in ancient pagan celebrations and that the tradition of parades started in Brazil but was influenced by the Portuguese Entrudo? In cities like Torres Vedras and Loulé, the festivities are famous for their floats and fun masks! In addition to Carnival, each year group is exploring fascinating themes through reading and writing:

- Reception Our youngest learners have started reading The Little Red Hen, a timeless story that teaches teamwork and responsibility. Will everyone help the hen bake the bread?
- Year 1 Our little adventurers are following Sofia on her incredible journey From London to Porto on a Seagull! This enchanting story sparks imagination and teaches us that there are no limits to our dreams. What would it be like to fly through the skies with a seagull as a companion? ❖
- ☐ Year 2 The theme of travel is in the spotlight! How can we travel? What are the most common means of transport? From trains to hot air balloons, our students are learning that the world is vast and full of possibilities! ◈

#### **Pupils with additional Medical needs**

We have pupils who are managing ongoing health conditions, some of which can result in them becoming immunocompromised. Please help us to protect them by being extra vigilant and reporting immediately any incidence of your child displaying symptoms of transferrable childhood illnesses such as Chickenpox, Measles, Scarlet fever, Slapped Cheek, Strep A or B.

#### **Medication Administration at School**

If your child is on long-term medication: they need to have a care plan at school. If anything changes on your child's medication plan, please update the school office. If your child needs short-term medication such as antibiotics during the school day, you will need to complete a medication administration authorisation form - you can contact the school office in advance to get this by email.




