We are delighted to inform you that APSOL has just received two awards!

The first school award was: The **Primary Science Quality Mark!** A special thanks to Ms Michelle Clough, Science Lead at APSOL, for supporting the school with this and gathering all the evidence for the application.



Primary Science Quality Mark is awarded to schools, recognises the school's commitment to developing excellence in science leadership, curriculum design, teaching and learning.

For over a decade, the Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) has been setting children on a path to a life filled with exciting possibilities and opportunities, by giving them access to a strong foundation in quality primary science education.

PSQM is a comprehensive year-long professional development and school improvement programme that gives primary science subject leaders the knowledge, capability and support needed to improve the quality and profile of science education across the entire school. Over 5,500 Quality Marks have now been awarded, impacting on the learning of over 1,000,000 children.

The Primary Science Quality Mark is led by the University of Hertfordshire.

Helen Sizer, PSQM Director said:

'The Primary Science Quality Mark recognises a whole school commitment to raising the profile and quality of science education, helping children recognise the value and relevance of science in their lives – both now and in the future. Achievement of the Quality Mark reflects the development of effective science leadership, visionary curriculum design and excellent teaching practice which is positively impacting on children's learning across the school. We have been impressed by the dedication of subject leaders, teachers, headteachers, pupils, parents, and governors alike – they all have reason to be incredibly proud.'

The second award is the **Rights Respecting Schools Silver Accreditation.** A special thanks to Mr Oscar Fielder, Assistant Headteacher, for supporting the school with this and gathering all the evidence for the application.









#### ASSESSOR COMMENT

The Anglo-Portuguese School of London (APSOL) has taken a proactive approach to embedding children's rights across the school. Pupils speak confidently about the UNCRC and the rights they hold, and a pupil said, 'I have the right to an education, to be safe and to play and relax'. Pupils at APSOL take ownership of their work on rights through class charters, leadership roles like the Eco and Article 12 Student Councils, and directly reflect on their learning through Subject Pupil Voice. Students feel like their voice is heard and that they have a say in their school community. For example, students have recently added gymnastics to the school Sports Day and have advocated for recycling programmes. A pupil said, 'The best thing about being in a Rights Respecting School is that we respect each other and work together to make things better'. Staff receive regular training, and parents are positively engaged in supporting rights at home. A parent shared, "I now see my child much more interested in his rights and the rights of others." Pupils understand how their rights help keep them safe and healthy, and they make thoughtful connections in their learning to rights. As one teacher noted, 'The children are definitely talking about rights a lot more now and making those links in lessons.'







Kidz Clean Kitchen - School catering from September Event for parents and carers Friday 27<sup>th</sup> June at 4pm


### Year 3 Trip to Kew Gardens

# **SCIENCE AT APSOL**

### Reception

Reception have been exploring shadows outside. They placed different objects on the ground and used a pencil to draw around the shadow they could see noticing that the shape of the shadow matched the object. It was an exciting way to learn through play and observation that a shadow is made when something blocks the light.





### Year 1

Y1 have been planting vegetables (carrots and radish) and flowers that attract garden pests to stop them eating our vegetables! We have been discussing whether we think they will grow better inside or outside. So, as part of a fair test, we have some growing in class and some growing in the reception outdoor area. We will monitor the growth over the coming weeks to find out where plants grow best in the summer months.







#### Year 2

Year 2 have been planting bulbs and seeds to investigate the affect of temperature on how plants grow.







### Year 3

Year 3 have been exploring forces and in this activity, they were experimenting with the force of friction. They set up a ramp, thought carefully about what they would change, keep the same and measure and then had a range of materials that they tested.





### Year 4

Earlier this term Year 4 planted their some seeds of different fruit and herbs they would like to grow. This work is a cross curricular link between DT and Science. Children will care for their seeds and monitor how they grow. At the end of this term children will take their plants home to enjoy with their family.









In Geography Year 4 watched a demonstration of a volcano erupting. They started by discussing the features of a volcano and what type of volcano the model could represent. Afterwards they spoke about the impact on people living around the volcano and how the threat of eruptions or the eruptions themselves might affect them and their families. This is part of our Geography unit on: Extreme Earth this term.
